

Student Safeguarding Information

If you are experiencing any problems that make you feel unsafe, unhappy or uncomfortable please talk directly to a member of our **Safeguarding Team**. You may be experiencing problems at home with your family, or found yourself in a position that made you feel vulnerable and distressed in or out of school. The **Safeguarding Team** will listen carefully, offer advice and provide any support that is necessary to keep you safe.

If you are concerned about your own safety or the safety of another student please discuss these concerns immediately with a member of our Safeguarding Team. For example, you may be concerned about;

- Smoking, drinking alcohol or using illegal drugs
- Sending inappropriate images of themselves via social media
- Meeting someone they have chatted to on-line
- Having sex under the age of 16
- Self-harming
- Being influenced by extremist views online, in school or in the community
- Being hit by parents, members of their family or boyfriend
- Being victimised for disrespecting the 'honour' of your family / community
- Being left at home unsupervised
- Being forced to do something against their will, ie being forced to marry someone they do not want to marry or forced into sexual activity with someone against your will
- Staying out very late in the evening or not going home.
- Becoming involved in local gangs
- Being bullied physically, emotionally or on-line via social media sites
- Being forced to leave the country against your will to undergo, for example, a female genital operation.

Please discuss all concerns about your or another student's safety with a member of our Safeguarding Team.
